

# SKENFRITH COMMUNITY COUNCIL ANNUAL REPORT 2023/24

# Skenfrith Community Council covers the villages of Skenfrith, Llanvetherine and Cross Ash.

### What we do

Community Councils are made up of local people who give their time to work for, and on behalf of, their community.

The Council meets monthly (except August and December) at Cross Ash village hall. Starting at 19:30, the meetings last approximately 1.5 hours and are open to the public. Our chief responsibility is to make known the concerns of local people to Monmouthshire County Council (MCC) and other public bodies for example the Police, Welsh Assembly Government, and Natural Resources Wales.

MCC has a duty to consult with Skenfrith Community Council over local services such as planning and licensing applications.

In addition, the Community Council:

- ·Provides small grants for local projects and charities.
- ·Owns and maintains notice boards.
- ·Owns and pays for maintenance of Skenfrith War Memorial.
- ·Consults with residents and makes recommendations on planning applications.
- ·Reports highway problems to MCC.
- ·Consults with MCC and the Police on issues of speed and road safety.
- ·Reports issues concerning public rights of way such as stiles, diversions, and blockages.
- ·Has a bio-diversity plan.
- ·Investigates resident enquiries and questions.

### What can we help you with?

Skenfrith councillors can act directly on your behalf on a number of issues such as potholes, and small grants.

Councillors represent the area and can make our voice heard on bodies such as village halls and One Voice Wales.

We can make direct communication with Monmouthshire County Council on issues such as highways, planning, public transport, and schools.

We are represented by County Councillor Ian Chandler (previously a Skenfrith Community councillor). He gives us a resume of issues that might directly affect the residents of Skenfrith Community Council area and is able to take local concerns back to the appropriate department at County Hall.
